Regarding the required diploma of language level, your nominees for exchange students next academic year 2016/2017 should have a diploma B1 in Spanish or Catalan (one or the other) before registering at our online application.

The B1 (Spanish or Catalan) Diploma therefore is a must for applying successfully to an ERASMUS programme at the University of Barcelona Medical School.

DÜSSELDORF:

Dear Erasmus coordinators and colleagues,

We have made the experience that many of our Erasmus incoming students do not have sufficient German language skills in order to successfully take part in lectures and exams at our Medical Faculty and sometimes even do not hand in the required language certificates on time. Therefore, we would like to remind you of our German language requirements for Erasmus students that come to the Medical Faculty of Düsseldorf.

Requirements for future Erasmus applicants (e.g. summer semester 2016):

Which level of German language skills is required at the Medical Faculty of Düsseldorf?

As we do not offer tuition in English and all lectures, courses and exams are in German, language skills of **at least B1** are absolutely necessary. We also offer a lot of clinical practice and for patient contact it is inevitable to have good language skills, especially in spoken German.

What types of language certificates are accepted?

We require an **official language certificate** (e.g. by Goethe Institute) that shows a level of B1 in writing, teaching, speaking AND listening. A confirmation by you as a coordinator, a certificate of a language course without exam or a certificate that only confirms one aspect of language competence (e.g. only in writing) CANNOT be accepted.

When and how does the language certificate have to be submitted?

Like all application documents the language certificates have to be uploaded within a certain deadline. For summer 2016 the application deadline is **January 15th**, **2016**We cannot accept language certificates after the application deadline, because the general administration can only send admissions after having received the language certificate.

What do I have to consider as a coordinator?

Before nominating students for Düsseldorf please check:

- 1.) That they already have an advanced knowledge of German (B1 at least, better B2, especially for clinical rotations). Many students believe they can learn German in one semester or a holiday course and have to face severe difficulties taking their first exams in Düsseldorf. Learning a language takes time and passing a language test B1 requires some years of learning.
- 2.) That they will be able to obtain an official language certificate B1 (listening, writing, speaking, reading) BEFORE our application deadline (Jul 15th for winter term / January 15th for summer term). Often students do have the required level, but think about taking the necessary test too late so that the exam date does not meet our deadline. This could be prevented if you could check with them potential exam dates.

Please nominate only students who meet the language criteria and inform them about the necessity of uploading the certificate within the respective application deadline.

A student already nominated for summer term 2016 does not meet the language criteria. Will the Medical Faculty of Düsseldorf make any exceptions?

We are sorry to say: No, we cannot. The necessity of holding an official German language certificate of level B1 (AND to upload it until the application deadline) has been on our website for several semesters. It is also mentioned in our recently renewed bilateral agreements. In the future, students who DO NOT meet these requirements will not be admitted to the Erasmus programme at the University of Düsseldorf and there will be NO MORE exceptions!
